INTERNSHIPS: You must get pre-approval from a faculty advisor and the DUS as well as enroll in an internship course before the internships begins. For an unpaid internship you can get up to 3 credits. Internships can be done during a semester or during the summer. The internship form is available online or you can pick up a copy in the main office (306 Riley Hall). For unpaid interships there are grants through College of Arts and Letters, and the Department of Art, Art History and Design that you can apply for.

STUDY ABROAD: We will accept 6 credits toward your major taken from a study abroad program. (Typically, one Elective and one Art History). You must meet with the Office of International Studies and get approval from the DUS before applying. You may take pre-approved courses, or seek out approval for any courses you take abroad that count towards your major.
